Native Flowering Deciduous Dogwoods: Flowers on bare branches.

Native to eastern North America, *Cornus florida* varieties bloom in April before leaves emerge. Provide burgundy-red Fall foliage & red berries in Winter for birds. Needs afternoon shade.

<u>Cultivar</u>	<u>Height</u>	
Appalachian Spring	25-30'	White flowers with purple-red Fall foliage.
Cherokee Brave	30'	Reddish pink flowers with burgundy Fall foliage.
Cherokee Chief	15-20'	Rose-red flowers with burgundy fall foliage.
Cherokee Princess	15-20'	White, largest flowers in early Spring.
Cloud 9	15-20'	Most prolific white flowers. Precocious bloomer.
Eternal/Bob Timberlake	15-20'	Double white flowers.
Firebird™	15'	Pnk & White flowers. Variegated foliage.

Kousa Dogwoods: Flowers on fresh green foliage.

Native to Japan, Korea, China & Taiwan, *Cornus kousa* varieties bloom May-June after leaves emerge. Tolerates more sun if watered regularly. Orange-red Fall foliage. Deciduous. Berry-like fruits that mature to pinkish-red, providing food to birds.

<u>Cultivar</u>	<u>Height</u>	
Greensleeves	20-25'	Creamy white blooms.
Heart Throb	20-25'	Reddish-pink flowers become darker as the tree matures.
Kousa	25-30'	White blooms.
Little Poncho	8-10'	Dwarf.
Milky way	20'	White blooms.

Hybrid Dogwoods

Bloom after Native Dogwoods and before Kousa Dogwoods.

<u>Cultivar</u>	<u>Height</u>	
Celestial® 'Rutdan'	20'	White flowers mature to pink. Does not produce berries.
Celestial Shadow®, Variegated	20-25'	Green/yellow Summer foliage turns pink/red in the Fall.
Stellar Pink® 'Rutgan'	20-25'	Pink blooms.
Stellar Pink® Variegated 'Rutgan'	20-25'	Pink blooms. Variegated leaves.
Venus®	20-30'	Large white flowers after leaves emerge.

Evergreen Dogwood: *Cornus angustata*

Empress of China 18' x 15' Profuse white blooms. Shade.

Shrub Dogwood

Red Twig (*Cornus sericea*) 6-8' Upright shrub planted for bright red stems in winter. Full Sun.

Note: Dogwood "flower petals" are actually modified leaves referred to as "bracts". The actual small Dogwood flower is in the center of the four bracts.
